Magkasama: Stories of Healing, Resilience, and Fortitude




Growing our CYFAMilya

Regions are similar to those of other FilAm associations to promote community engagement. Because trainees may move for education, members may designate more than one region.




CYFAM Membership Over Time






Conference Attendees by Training Level

Vania Manipod, DO

"Immigration and Structural Racism: History, Health, and Wellbeing Among Filipina/x/o Americans"

Adrian Matias Bacong, PhD, MPH is a postdoctoral research scholar with the Stanford University School of Medicine – Division of Cardiovascular Medicine and the Center for Asian Health Research and Education. His research explores the intersections of immigration and structural racism on health, specifically among Asian individuals. Maria Rosario "Happy" Araneta, PhD, MPH

"Unrecognized Type 2 Diabetes Prevalence and Unique Risk Factors among Filipinos"

Maria Rosario (Happy) G. Araneta PhD, MPH, is Professor of Epidemiology in the Department of Family Medicine, and Associate Dean for Diversity and Community Partnerships at the University of California San Diego (UCSD) School of Medicine. She is the co-Principal Investigator of the Diabetes Prevention Program Outcomes Study (DPPOS) where UC San Diego is one of 26 participating sites, and PI of the UCSD Filipino Health Study, a longitudinal study of diabetes and metabolic

abnormalities among Filipino men and women.





Hannah Divino

"Heal Self, Heal Others: Reimagining Inclusive Medicine and Culturally-Rooted Healing"

Hannah Rhea Divino is a Pinay, second generation immigrant, and mental health advocate raised in South Stockton. With a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Sociology and Psychology at UC Davis and Masters of Social Work degree in progress, she hopes to facilitate individual and collective healing for marginalized communities in Stockton.

Paul Adam Gonzales, MD is a Postdoctoral Research Fellow at the UCSF Center for Mindfulness in Surgery. His research interests include how mindfulness training affects burnout and stress in surgery residents. He conducts quantitative and qualitative research methods to investigate factors that influence well-being in surgery training and inform the design of tailored system-level interventions to improve physician well-being. He is an international medical graduate (IMG) pursuing residency training in surgery.



Jessica de Leon, MD

"Resilience in Medicine: A Young Filipinx Physician Panel" Dr. Jessica de Leon received her undergraduate degrees in neuroscience and Spanish at Johns Hopkins University and her MD with thesis degree at UCSF. She then completed a medicine internship, neurology residency, and behavioral neurology fellowship at UCSF. Dr. de Leon is currently an assistant professor at the UCSF Memory and Aging Center (MAC), where she focuses on care of patients with cognitive impairment and dementia. She also evaluates children with learning differences at the UCSF Dyslexia Center and is an attending neurologist in the Geriatrics Neurology Cognitive Clinic at Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital.



Natasha Abadilla, MD

Natasha is a first-generation Filipino American who was born and raised on the island of Kauai in Hawaii. Her parents are both from Ilocos Norte. She attended Stanford University for undergrad, receiving her Bachelor's Degree in Human Biology, lived and worked for 2 years in Kenya with non-profits and healthcentered social enterprises, then returned to Stanford for medical school and is now in her 2nd year as a resident physician in the Department of Pediatrics and Child Neurology.



Don Dizon, MD, FACP, FASCO

Don S. Dizon is a Professor of Medicine and Professor of Surgery at Brown University and serves as the Vice Chair of Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Professional Engagement at SWOG Cancer Research Network, a member of the National Cancer Institute's National Clinical Trials Network. He is a medical oncologist specializing in pelvic malignancies, survivorship particularly as it pertains to sexual health for men and women with cancer, and social media.

Lauren Sanchez, MD, MA

Dr. McClure hails from Hayward California, and attended UC Berkeley then Keck USC School of Medicine. She has practiced Internal Medicine in Vallejo for 16 years and is currently splitting her time between home visits for homebound patients and skilled nursing facilities. She has served as Co-chair for the Filipinx Mental Health Initiative (Solano-Napa) and she is also a senior dancer with the LIKHA Pilipino Folk Ensemble, based in Oakland, CA.



Angela Sy, DrPH

Angela Sy is an Associate Professor at the John A Burns School of Medicine, University of Hawaii (UH). She conducts community based participatory research with a focus on program evaluation among immigrant communities in Hawai`i—Filipino, Pacific Islander. At the faculty level, she evaluates programs within the UH and across partnering institutions to promote the research and academic careers of Indigenous and Pacific People (e.g., Native Hawaiian, Filipino) faculty and other groups who are underrepresented in academia.

Kevin Reyes

Kevin Reyes is currently a 3rd year UCSF medical student with an interest in internal medicine, hematology/oncology, cancer immunotherapies, and health disparities. He was born in San Antonio, Texas before living for a few years in the Philippines and eventually stayed in the US in northern California. In his free time, he enjoys hiking, weightlifting, playing tennis and basketball, and reading.





Angelico Razon, MD, MPH, MSHP

Dr. Angelico Razon is a Assistant Professor in Health Systems Science at Kaiser Permanente School of Medicine. His research interests include patient- and community-centered system design and policy interventions to promote patient self-efficacy and address social determinants of health. His research focuses on transitions of care, especially with how Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs (CYSHCN) access the healthcare services as they develop into adults.



Edgar Miles C. Leviste, MD, FAAP

Edgar Miles C. Leviste, MD, FAAP is a pediatric hospitalist with Atrium Health. He was awarded a Fulbright Fellowship in the Philippines before medical school, specifically working on establishing telemedicine stroke care in this archipelago nation of more than 7,000 islands.



Melissa Palma, MD, MPH

Melissa Palma, MD, MPH (she/her/siya) is an Iowa-raised daughter of Filipino immigrants. She graduated with degrees in biochemistry and medicine from the University of Iowa and began her career dedicated to the health of historically excluded populations with an emphasis on immigrant and refugee health. Her medical school Global Health capstone project focused on health education programs for rural migrant farmworkers and a needs assessment of refugee social services in Iowa. Dr. Palma also trained in Preventive Medicine and Family Medicine at Cook County Health in Chicago, IL.

Ronald H. Labuguen, MD

Ronald H. Labuguen, M.D., is a Professor of Family and Community Medicine at the University of California, San Francisco. He is the Medical Director of the Adult Urgent Care Center at Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center (ZSFG), and a volunteer faculty preceptor with Mabuhay Health Center, a volunteer and UCSF student-run free clinic serving mostly Filipino patients living in the South of Market area of San Francisco. 
